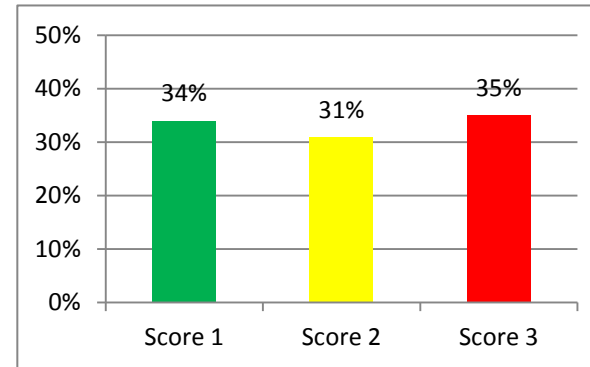

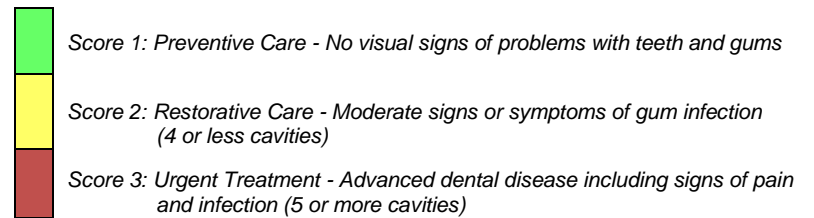
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ORAL HEALTH REPORT CARD

PATIENT SATISFACTION

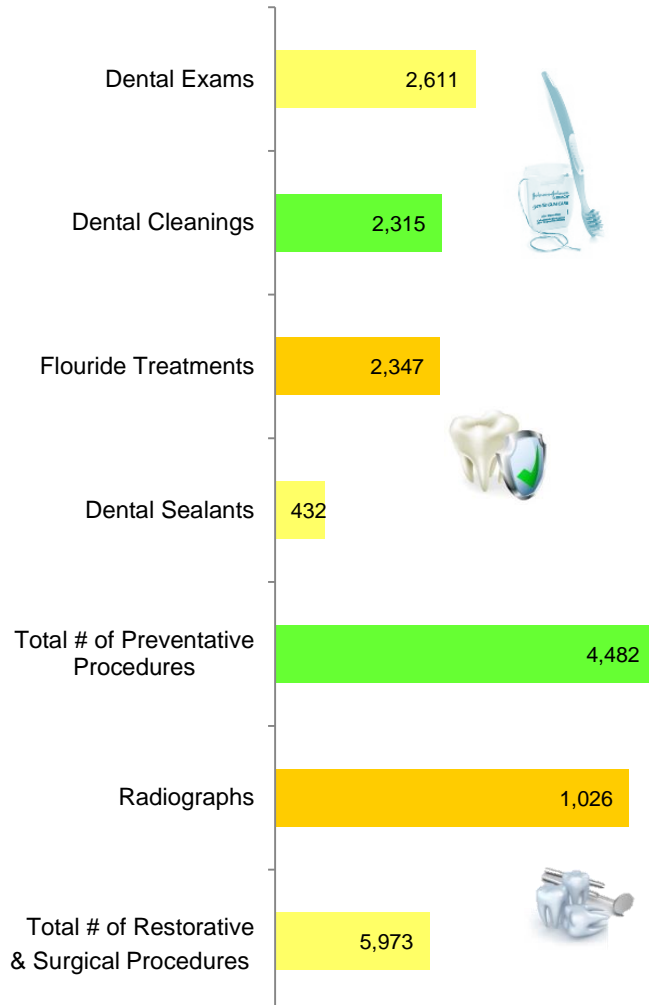
At the end of each dental visit, patients are asked how they felt about their dental visit using the rule of thumb satisfaction scale.



The SBL Dental Team scored a 2.91 out of 3 patient satisfaction score.

A LETTER FROM OUR DIRECTOR

To our valued volunteers, partners, communities, and friends:

Tooth decay is the most common chronic childhood disease. Untreated tooth decay is not only painful, but also may affect a child’s ability to eat and speak. Poor oral health is also detrimental to a child’s learning and success in school, contributing to school absences and lower grades. Delta Dental of Illinois’ 2016 survey results show there is need for improvement in Illinois:

- **29%** of Illinois children have had cavities in the past year.
- Only **65%** of Illinois children who have visited a dentist have done so before age 5 when children should visit the dentist by age 1.
- **40%** of Illinois children do not brush their teeth the recommended two times per day.

However, the same survey of Illinois parents also showed that kids who take good care of their teeth are more outgoing, confident and successful than those who do not have good oral health habits. Illinois parents report that children who brush their teeth at least two times a day are more likely to be successful (66 percent), outgoing (73 percent) and proud of themselves (76 percent). Parents report that one in five Illinois children ages 6 to 12 missed school last year because of oral health problems.

“Pain caused by oral health problems can affect a child in many ways from their ability to focus in the classroom to their confidence,” said Katina Spadoni, DDS, dental director for Delta Dental of Illinois. “Good oral health is a key component to a child’s overall well-being. Not only will good oral health give a child confidence, but it can also help a child succeed in school.” According to Delta Dental of Illinois’ survey, oral health is a top concern for parents. Nearly three in four parents (67 percent) cite their child’s oral health as a top concern that they think about daily, in line with other top concerns, including their child’s performance in school (55 percent), diet and nutrition (68 percent) and physical activity (53 percent).

This annual report tells a great story about the power of our program to impact the lives of children in our 9-county service area. We are proud of the role SBL Dental Services plays in addressing these urgent dental needs in our area. This past year, we were able to provide dental care for over 2,400 children. In FY 2017, the value of our care to children at school locations was \$769,884 which does not include summer clinics and after school care provided. We are thankful for our partnerships with 66 local elementary and secondary schools, local health departments, and the Regional Office of Education #11. As a non-profit, SBL Dental Services could not survive solely on the reimbursement it receives from Illinois Medicaid. We depend on donations and grants to continue to help the uninsured and underserved children in our service area.

It is truly an honor to be able to work with such a wonderful, caring staff and create healthy communities.

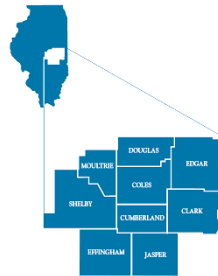


WHO WE ARE

Sarah Bush Lincoln Dental Services is a collaborative community effort that provides dental care at no cost to families who qualify.

Our staff consists of a Medical Director, volunteer dentists, dental hygienists, dental assistants, oral health educators, and office staff.

The program serves a nine-county service area including Clark, Coles, Cumberland, Douglas, Edgar, Effingham, Jasper, Moultrie, and Shelby counties.

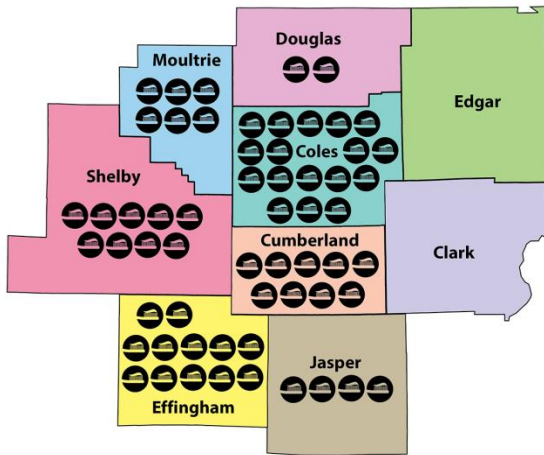

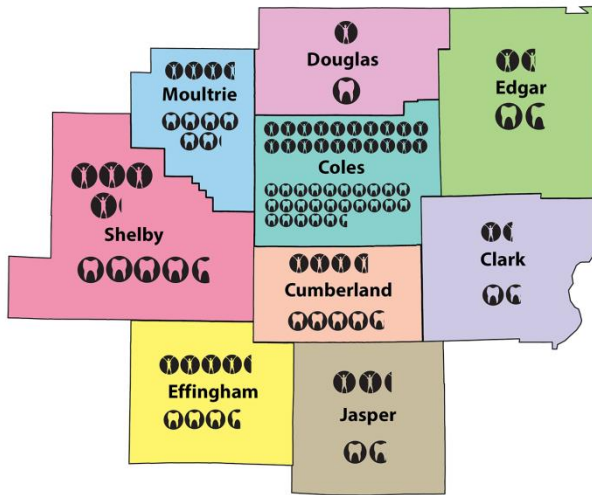

WHAT'S NEW?

NEW FIXED SITE

SBL opened a new fixed site in Mattoon and began seeing patients in April 2018. This site serves patients who need emergency care as well as provide a location for clinic days during the summer and on days when there is no school.



A fixed site also provides us with a location where we can take more time with patients who have special needs and/or would benefit from a more private setting than the mobile unit.

We are thankful for a grant from the Illinois Children’s Health Foundation which helped to outfit the new fixed site with equipment such as dental chairs, delivery systems, minor equipment, supplies, etc.



WHAT'S NEW?

NOW OFFERING ADULT SERVICES

Beginning October 1, 2017, SBL Dental Services began treating adults who meet specific criteria.

The SBL Board of Directors has directed funds to begin to address this need. After this year, we will evaluate the program to determine next steps in the treatment of adults.

Adults must live in our 9-county service area and be referred to our program by a SBL provider. They must meet one of two criteria:

- Dental clearance is needed for another medical procedure like surgery or cancer treatments.
- Urgent dental care with pain, infection or injury being present. Patients receive a \$500 voucher to use for urgent treatment at one of our 6 local dental partners.

To date: **\$179,000** has been provided by SBL for Adult Dental Services.

This map shows the service areas covered by the mobile clinics associated with the Illinois Regional Coalition of the Mobile Health Clinics Association.



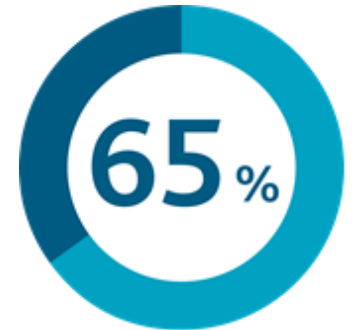
